# Around the Parish Yard:

I just returned from eight days at a CREDO conference hosted by the Church Pension Fund. We attended to items pertinent to senior parochial clergy (both practical & spiritual) and how to live with God's call on our lives? Nearly all of what we prayed over and discussed together are topical for us at St. Luke's.

We live in a world that is preposterously complicated, individualized and increasingly uncertain. Our institutions and relationships among individuals in the public domain seem to challenge our assumptions we are predisposed to daily. While this has become part of daily life; our experience of who 'we are' as individuals, people in communities of faith and civic life, has been further eroded by events, terrors, and tragedy that previously have been unimagined. I cannot help but reflect on the most recent event of gun violence and murder that took place at the <u>Pulse Night Club</u> in Orlando. These things are brought into our lives with breathtaking speed by our media and communication technologies.

In this new paradigm of terror, greed, injustice, incivility, wickedness, and inhumanity it becomes difficult to see objectively what our lives are about; with God becoming more and more distant from our eyes. So...I want to leave you with this truth.

In Christ, we can find the balance, strength and resolve we are looking for in these challenging times. We can find true riches that last and bring to our families things that are true. Jesus said that those who are faithful in the little things...would be faithful in much. He was telling people then, as he is telling us now, not to be filled with the things that happen randomly in the world, but pay attention to fixing the things of evil and injustice, by attending to all the small things around us we can directly affect as ambassadors of Christ.

We as individuals and families are thirsty for paths in life that are <u>true</u>, <u>holy</u> and of <u>God</u>. People in a very real sense are looking to find the *'heartbeat of goodness'*. This summer...let us take time to look for those truths in the face of Christ; by living with and being part of St. Luke's Sea Cliff. The love and affection of heaven be with you...
